From the 46 Connected Ranch

The Annual She-Bang will the first weekend in October. Please see the article in this issue of The Howler, provided by Lap Dog, for the detailed plans for the She-Bang. The scenarios for several of the stages for this event have already been set-up, as has the stage for the team-shoot side match. Although I do not know how they will be shot, the set-ups certainly look very interesting. And Bones Brannon has designed a most unique BB gun target for this side-match!

Several of the folks stayed around after the shooting was over on August 31st and helped to clean up some of the range in preparation for the She-Bang. I know that Saturday the 28th is the fourth Saturday of this month and the 29th is the 5th Sunday, which means the Poso River Vigilance Committee will be shooting on the 28th and the Chorro Valley Regulators will be shooting again on the 29th. I imagine several of you will be taking advantage of this opportunity; however, if any of you will be staying around Bakersfield that weekend, I invite you to join me at the 5 Dogs Creek on the morning of the 28th for some final clean-up before the She-Bang the following weekend.

In the past two issues of The Howler I have mentioned that many of our old benches have become something of a hazard. Mescalero and Huckleberry Flash constructed three new prototype benches that have been on the range for a month or so now. I mentioned at the recent Town Council Meeting that I was inclined to go ahead and authorize the construction of more new benches, which I have done. We will also take a look at the old benches to see which ones we might be able to reinforce sufficiently to keep in service.

The Town Council also authorized the construction of a number of new pistol targets. Our Sheriff, Fordyce Beals will be obtaining the steel for these targets and our Blacksmith, Bones Brannon will be welding the bracket supports on to the backs of the targets.

As I announced earlier, we now have in-hand written confirmation that we will be hosting the 2014 SASS California State Championship May 1 – 4. A worksheet for this annual event, which we preface as The Shootout at 5 Dogs Creek, has been created and reviewed by the Town Council. The purpose of the worksheet is, of course, to keep us on track and to meet the necessary deadlines in the planning process. Some of the service providers we have used in the past have already been contacted. I would be remiss if I did not mention that our Banker, Miss Barah Lee Misditt, has taken the lead in making several of these contacts. Further details will be provided as the planning progresses.

I would in closing like to make "a pitch," one I believe the Mad Trapper of Rat River made during his tenure as Mayor. We recycle, well actually our Store Keeper, El Alacran Del Norte and Foxy School Marm recycle, all the water bottles and soda cans collected at the range. The proceeds are what help us to pay for the water that is available during our monthly competitions. "My pitch" is for those of you that may not need the money from recyclable water bottles or soda cans, please bring them to the range in a garbage bag, or box, or whatever, and we will take care of them!

So, until we meet at the She-Bang, or the work-party on the 28th, keep your horse shod, your guns clean, your powder dry, and negotiate those "trails" safely!.
