


Abraham Henson Meadows was born in a snowstorm in Elbow Creek, Tulare, California in either 1859 or 1860. His family moved to Arizona in 1877. He grew up to be a big, strapping cowboy, standing six feet six inches. In 1889 Buffalo Bill Cody saw Tom Horn and Meadows rope in Tucson and offered them both a job. Tom Horn declined; however, "Arizona Charlie" as Meadows was known, accepted and ended up touring the world with Buffalo Bill's Wild West show. Eventually Meadows opened his own show (True West, May 2014:65).

When gold was discovered in the Yukon Territory, Meadows made the trek to the Territory and built the Palace Grand Theater in Dawson, which is still in operation. After he cashed out, he retired to Yuma, Arizona. He thought the city's hot climate would allow him to beat the premonition that he would die as he was born, in a snowstorm (p. 65).

On December 9, 1932 a freak snowstorm hit Yuma, and "Arizona Charlie" died after operating on his varicose veins with a pocket knife. He was 73 years old (p. 65)
