Between the years 1883 and 1916 Buffalo Bill's Wild West offered dangerous feats of trick riding by his "Buffalo Gals" who made up the "American Amazon Act." Buffalo Bill referred to these performers as "a mixture of feminine delicacy and masculine will." One of his most remarkable talents was a young, daredevil woman named Adele Von Ohl Parker (True West, January 2014:20).

Adele was from a prominent New Jersey family that had been in the horse business since supplying horses to George Washington's army during the Revolutionary War. Adele was on horseback when she was barely able to walk. She became a fearless horsewoman and trick rider with aspirations of becoming an actress. She left home in 1902 to pursue acting. When the Wild West show came through New York in 1908 she joined up and quickly became a star. In 1909 she married Jim Parker, another star performer; together they joined a new show known as Cheyenne Days (p. 20).

When ticket sales began to drop for Cheyenne Days, Adele and her husband moved to Los Angeles and rode into the fictional life of early Hollywood movies, where "life imitated art, imitating life." She appeared on film as stunt rider for characters of the Old West. By 1929 the Great Depression had stranded her in Cleveland, Ohio where, with little money, she was attempting to launch her own show. But instead of starting "her show," she started a riding school in North Olmstead; the Parker Ranch. Adele spent the next 37 years teaching young people, as one of her students reminisced, she taught us "as much about life as she did about riding" (p. 20)



The great "Buffalo Gal" died in 1969. Ohio historical markers commemorate the site of the Parker Ranch. Another one of her students wrote that Adele had "opened a world of flying mounts and dismounts, on horses that were often castoffs....We were horsecrazy kids who found a gold mine of love and horsemanship embodied in a woman who will never be forgotten" (p. 20). And so, Adele Von Ohl Parker, herself one of those "horse-crazy kids," has indeed not been forgotten!
