One of the great joys of retirement and being a cowboy action shooter is you can travel, see and do things and shoot. *Wanderin' Rose* and I recently took a month long BLT. No we didn't eat bacon, lettuce and tomato sandwiches for a month; BLT in this case stands for a Bucket List Trip. Ever since I heard there was cowboy shooting as a part of the Huntsman World Senior Games it has been on my bucket list. So this was the year.

The games are held in St. George, Utah (about a 6 hour drive from Bakersfield) the first weekend of October. The competition is open to anyone over the age of 50 and, in this case, I.D. is required when you register. You have to keep those darn youngsters at bay. Although there were over 11,000 participants at the games as a whole, the cowboy match is quite small by most standards. This year there were 103 shooters at the match which is always hosted by the Dixie Desperadoes. More on that later.

The competition is set up a little differently than a regular shooting match. In this case, all categories are age based, starting at age 50-54, 55-59 and so on all the way up as far as there are entries. For example, this year Washougal Will shot in the 85-89 class. Hope I can be there someday. Needless to say, he won the gold and got a standing ovation at the awards banquet. In addition to age-based, you have all the regular shooting categories, including Wild Bunch, Plainsman, Long Range, all regular side matches and few more to boot. They pack in a lot of shooting!

The Dixie Desperadoes have created a top-notch range (the best in Utah) and certainly do know how to put on a match. They should, they do three or four matches a year. I have never been to a match that was run as efficiently as this one. Club members are just the greatest bunch one could ever meet and a true representation of the cowboy spirit. There was breakfast laid on every morning, a chili potluck, an ice cream social complete with root beer floats and on and on...

The match itself was fast, fast, and faster, Targets were close but not ridiculously so. Posses were just right at 15 shooters and the one I was on was one of the best. We knew only two others, Alberta Annie and Southwest Trapper, but after two days we have many new friends which is how it should be.

Would I recommend this shoot? Ya bet yer bippy! We hope to go back and would welcome any 5 Dogs Creek members to come along. Plan now, you won't be sorry.

But wait, there's more.... After the games the BLT continued and we went to one on Rose's list, Antelope Canyon.
