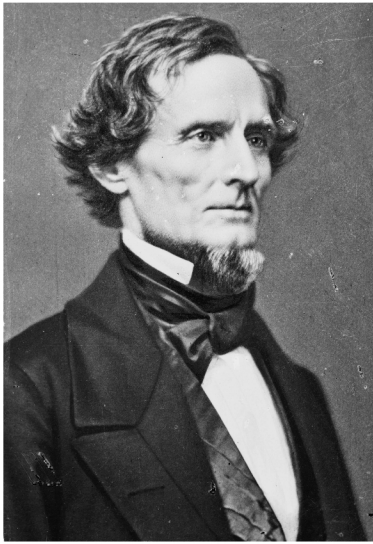

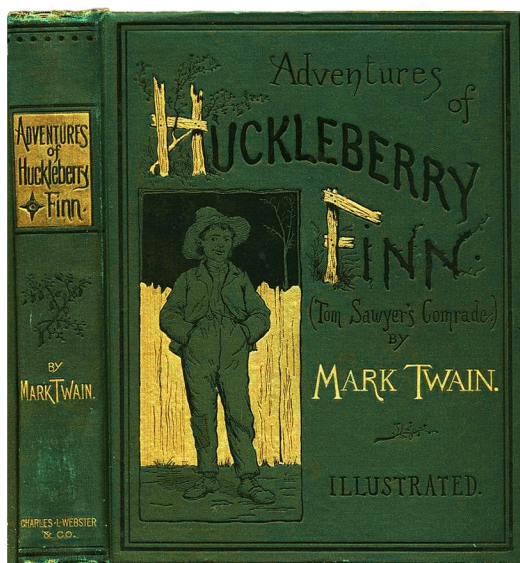

Some interesting things I found that happened this month in history...on the internet...while working on the newsletter.



February 18, 1861, Jefferson Davis was sworn in as President of the Confederacy.

April 22, 1879, the first Woolworth's 5 and 10 Cent Store opened in New York.



February 18, 1885, author Mark Twain, published The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn.

These are the last of the working cowhands from the Hash Knife ranch, orginated in 1875 by J.R. Coutts near Abilene in Texas.



The name originated due to the registered ranch brand resembling a meat cutter by the same name.

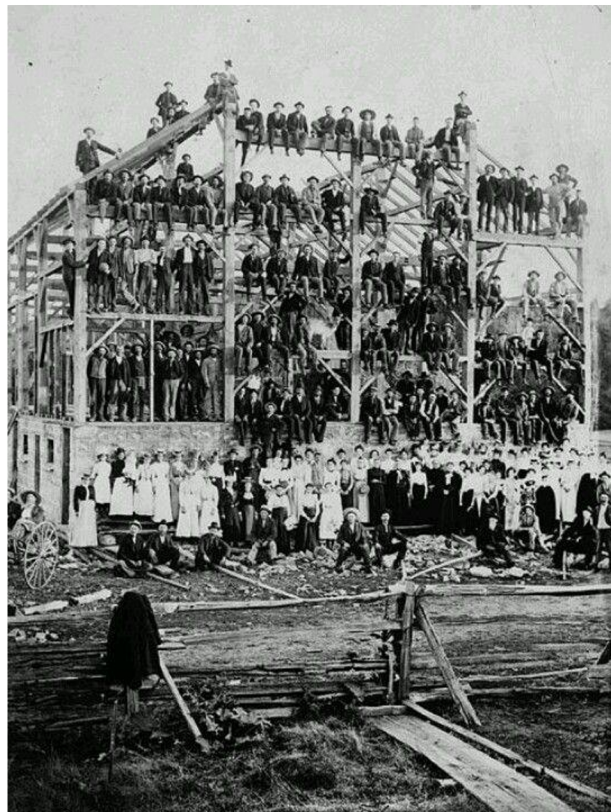


The ranch changed owners to the Aztec Land & Cattle Company in 1885 and the headquarters was moved to between Holbrook and Flagstaff, AZ. This was the "Hash Knife Outfit," immortalized in the novels of Zane Grey, whose employees became involved, to some extent, in the Graham-Tewksbury feud during the 1880's and 1890's.



Women were outlaws too. This is Cattle Annie and Little Britches. There was a movie made about their life.
