The Central California Range War will be held each year during the annual match of the club that currently has claim to the coveted title of “winner.” The Range War will begin in May 2006 during the Shootout at 5 Dogs Creek. This is basically a match within a match. The Range War will have no impact on the standings of the annual match.

All club members registered for the annual match where the Range War takes place will compete for their respective club. No chickens allowed. Traitors who are members of more than one club must declare their allegiance to just one in advance of the match.

Everyone will have an opportunity to represent their club and all categories will be included equally.

For each stage of the annual match, five names will be selected randomly for each of the three clubs. That is, five random members of the Chorro Valley Regulators, five members of the Kings River Regulators and five members of 5 Dogs Creek will be drawn out of a hat to represent their club on Stage 1; another five names will be drawn for each club for Stage 2; etc. etc.

Once all names have been selected for a particular club, all the names for that club go back into the random selection. A smaller club may have some members competing more often than a larger club.

The competitors for each stage will NOT be announced in advance. All cowboys should be at the top of their game at all times.

The times for those selected for each stage will be totaled (inclusive of misses/bonuses). A panel of three – one member of each club – will tally the scores to keep each other honest. The club with the fastest total time wins, will keep the yet-to-be-determine-but-highly-coveted award and will host the Range War at their next annual match.


We are on winter hours. So the match starts at 10am with a 9:30am shooters meeting.
